CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP

Just like Year 5, the CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP will still run each week. However, now they are in Year 6, the expectation of the children is even higher! Each week, the children can earn POINTS for showing different learning and life skills, with the person who earns the most by Friday afternoon becoming CLASS CHAMPION. The skills are the same as the ones you worked on in Year 5, but being in Year 6 the expectation of how well you do these things will be higher. TEAMWORK is especially important, as in Year 6 we have to set the best example we can to the younger children!

Excellent basic hygiene is going to continue to play a massive role in school, so we will continue to encourage frequent hand washing. On top of this, the children also need to make sure that they sneeze or cough into their elbow, before then washing their hands.
