Homework

Home work with completed spellings should be handed in every Monday. New stickers for spelling will be added and points added for time on the bouncy castle on rewards morning.

Please ensure your child's Phonics reading books are in their book bag every day. The children read every morning when they arrive in class.

Children will be awarded certificates for the levels they have completed on Numbots.

Talk home work is optional, however it is a lovely way for you to share what the children have been learning in class. It is also a good way for us to revisit topics and things we may have found tricky in class.

Phonics videos are sent each Friday. It makes a big difference for children to be accessing this additional learning at home and we would like to encourage everyone to support children to access these weekly moving forward.

Clothing

We aim to keep the children as active as possible during break and lunch times and therefore all children will need to wear practical footwear for school. Velcro shoes are most practical if children cannot tie shoe laces. We encourage children to develop their independence, so children are also encouraged to fasten their own coats.



Please ensure clothing and footwear are **named**.

During the cold months, please ensure your child brings a hat, gloves and warm coat .

Forest area

This term we would like to make use of the forest area attached to school. To be able to access this space we will need children to have a pair of wellies in school. If your child does not have wellies in school please could you send some in, or an old pair of shoes/boots which you do not mind getting muddy. Please ensure they are clearly labelled.

Fruit

As part of the National Fruit Scheme, EYFS and Key Stage 1 children receive fruit or vegetables daily. Children can also bring in their own snack if they prefer, however this must be a healthy snack from home e.g. a cereal bar or fruit. Chocolate and crisps are not allowed. Thank you for your support.



P.E

Children will be required to come into school dressed in their PE kit (joggers/shorts, t-shirt and a jumper) on a **Monday**. If your child wears earrings, they will need to be removed by your child, removed before school, or tape can be provided for the PE session.



Dream Reads

We will be continuing our popular 'Dream Read' scheme in class. This is designed to provide children with opportunities to share age related childhood books with their adults at home. The books are designed to be read by the adult and this provides brilliant learning opportunities. The children choose their Dream Read book every Friday, therefore all Dream Read books need to be returned every **Friday**.

We discourage children from putting water bottles in their bags as they often leak and damage school books. Accidents do happen with books that have been brought home, so if this happens please let us know so we can discuss a replacement book so other children do not miss out.

Gold Writer Award is given to the child who has tried extremely hard in writing.

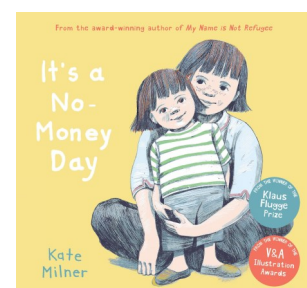
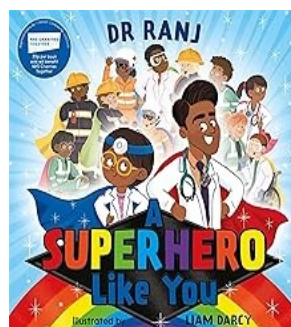
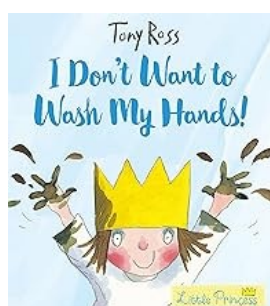
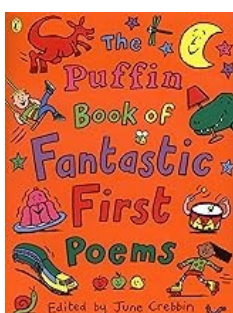
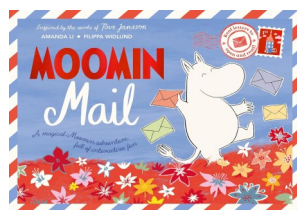
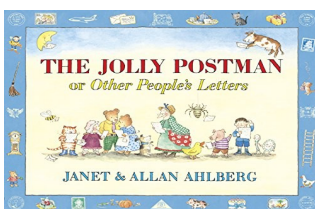
Arthur postcards are still up for grabs and we can't wait for you to collect many more postcards as the term gets underway!
